VICTORIA

CRAIG

Those bastards.

VICTORIA

No, I fell in love with it. So, I took a buyout from the firm, came back home and now I'm teaching English at Studs Terkel.

CRAIG

You work at our old high school?

That's crazy. Yeah... I've given back too. I've done some substitute music teaching around town when I needed the money.

VICTORIA

No they're not. Remember, I went here. SHE STARTS OFF.

CRAIG (CONT'D)

But I thought we had a great time last night.

VICTORIA

We did. Individually. (THEN) Last night I ran into a fun guy I haven't seen since High School. This morning he shows up at my work.

CRAIG

Our work.

VICTORIA

See? Like that. You've gone from charming to alarming.

CRAIG

But it's a sexy kind of alarming. Like how they rank chili.

VICTORIA

Craig, this is not your second chance at asking me to prom. And for the last time, I have a boyfriend.

CRAIG

So you're technically single?

VICTORIA

Or absolutely in a relationship. Goodbye, Craig.
